### *Conserving Water*

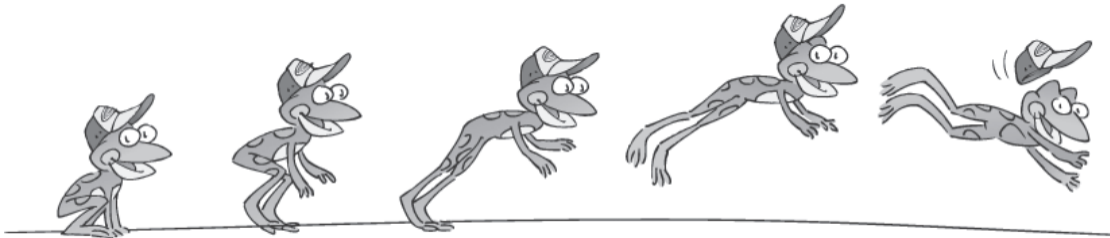
- Water your lawn early in the morning or in the evening. If you water during the middle of the day, more than 1/4 of the water can evaporate.
- Regularly check toilets, sinks, showers, and pipes for leaks.
- Run your dishwasher and washing machine only when they are full.
- Keep a bottle of drinking water in the refrigerator. A lot of water is wasted when you run the tap to make water colder.

### *Protecting the Environment*

- Do not pour motor oil, cleaners, or other hazardous household items down the drain.
- Do not pour grease into sinks, garbage disposals, and toilets.
- Participate in ReWa's Reedy River Sweep and other activities that clean up our environment.

Renewable Water Resources (ReWa), established in 1925, is a special purpose district of the State of South Carolina serving Greenville County and parts of Anderson, Spartanburg and Laurens Counties. The organization operates and maintains 300 miles of sewer trunk lines and 12 major wastewater treatment facilities and treats 40 million gallons of wastewater daily. ReWa is governed by a 9-member commission that is appointed by the Governor upon the recommendation of the Greenville County Legislative Delegation.
