FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENT DISCHARGE PERMIT

In accordance with all terms and conditions of the Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority Sewer Use and Pretreatment Regulation and also with any applicable provisions of Federal or State law or regulation:

Conditions of Acceptance

1. All discharges authorized herein shall be consistent with the terms and conditions of this permit. Any anticipated modifications which will result in new, different, or increased discharges of pollutants must be reported by submission of a new Discharge Permit Application or, if such changes will not violate limitations/conditions specified in this permit, by notice to the Director of such changes. Following such notice, the permit may be modified to specify and limit any pollutants not previously limited.
2. All discharges shall comply with the WCRSA Sewer Use and Pretreatment Regulation; especially, Section 4.0, Prohibitions and Limitations on Wastewater Discharges, Section 2.11, Special Pretreatment Devices, and Attachment F – Grease Control Strategy of the Regulation. Also, your company shall maintain the following documents:

A copy of the SCDHEC License shall be submitted to the Pretreatment Department.

Log of grease interceptor maintenance activities shall be accessible to WCRSA personnel upon request.

3. Food Service Establishments shall pay the Permit Application Processing and Renewal Fee for the approval to discharge to WCRSA. Food Service Establishments shall also pay all Laboratory Analyses Fees associated with the discharge to WCRSA. Such fees and charges shall be as established from time to time and included in Attachment B Fees and Charges of the Sewer Use and Pretreatment Regulation.
4. Should SCDHEC issue any order or regulation affecting the POTW and its discharge into which the permittee discharges, appropriate restrictions/actions may be required of the permittee discharging into said POTW to ensure compliance.
5. Provisions in the Sewer Use and Pretreatment Regulation regarding monitoring, inspection, and right of entry to the Food Service Establishment's facility are incorporated fully herein and shall be implemented to assure that maintenance is being completed on any pretreatment device as indicated on the maintenance log and that the information provided is accurate and complete.
6. Food Service Establishment Permits are issued to a specific user for a specific operation. A permit shall not be reassigned or transferred or sold to a new owner, new user, or for different vehicle, unless approved by the Director.
7. WCRSA may revoke a User's discharge permit for the following reasons:

Violation of the conditions of the Food Service Establishment's discharge permit.

Failure of the Food Service Establishment to report with reasonable accuracy the constituents.

Failure of the Food Service Establishment to report significant changes in operations or wastewater constituents and characteristics.

Refusal by the Food Service Establishment of reasonable access to its facility for inspection or monitoring purposes.

Tampering with or knowingly altering WCRSA's monitoring equipment.

8. The permittee must apply in writing for a renewal permit not less than 180 days prior to expiration of the current permit. Provided further that limitations or conditions of a permit are subject to modification as may become necessary due to changes in applicable water quality standards, the WCRSA's NPDES permit, discharge effluent limitations, other applicable law or regulation, or for other just cause. The permittee will be notified of any proposed changes in this permit by the Director at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of the change. Any change or new condition in this permit shall include a provision for a reasonable time schedule for compliance. The permittee may appeal the decision of the Director in regard to any changed permit conditions. This permit is considered stayed should delays by WCRSA result in a renewal permit not being issued upon expiration.
9. In accordance with Section 8, Enforcement, noncompliance with the requirements in this letter or the Regulation may result in enforcement action, including civil penalties of up to \$2,000 per day. Additionally, in accordance with Section 5, Revenue System, your company will be charged fees to recover the cost of pretreatment and laboratory activities.
10. All Food Service Establishment discharge may be sampled by a WCRSA representative and randomly tested for compliance with the Sewer Use Regulation. The analyses will be performed by the WCRSA Laboratory Section or a SCDHEC certified laboratory as determined by the WCRSA.
11. The permittee is required to retain, onsite, for a minimum of three (3) years any records of monitoring activities and results and shall make such records available for inspection and copying by the Director, South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control, or the Environmental Protection Agency. This period of retention shall be extended during the course of any unresolved litigation regarding the permittee or when requested by the Director, SCDHEC, or the EPA.
12. The permittee shall achieve compliance with the limitations specified for discharges in accordance with the following schedule: N/A
