Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority Receives State Environmental Awards

Greenville, S.C. (June 23, 2008) – The Blue Ridge Foothills District of the Water Environment Association of South Carolina (WEASC) recently recognized Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority with the Biosolids and Residual Management Award at the South Carolina Environmental Conference (SCEC).

This award recognizes Western Carolina for: significant recycling or reuse of natural resources such as nutrients, organic matter or energy; its sustained project for several years that is full-scale with proven operation; consistent, cost-effective operation; public acceptance; compliant with all federal, state and local regulations; and excellence in project management.

Williams Armes, of Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority (WCRSA) was presented with the Water Environmental Federation (WEF) Quarter Century Operator Award, which honors the operators of water or wastewater treatment and transportation facilities for their service and dedication.
