### **Western Carolina Reaches Out to Fountain Inn Elementary School**

Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority recently reached out to Fountain Inn Elementary School students through Grease Inspector, Kim, McDonald, who was there to promote ways to help the environment through the organization's *Grease-Be-Gone* program! Over 160 students and teachers from 7 classes attended the presentation and learned how to properly dispose of grease and how to help protect the environment from pollutants.

The presentation taught the students about the water cycle, how water is treated and cleaned and how Western Carolina works everyday to protect the environment and Greenville. The students were encouraged to do their part in protecting the environment with tools, including a *Grease-Be-Gone* can. The Fountain Inn Garden Club also participated in the event and distributed refreshments to all in attendance.
