WCRSA Participates in Touch-A-Truck Event

Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority provided a Sewer Jet Truck to this year's Touch-A-Truck event presented by the Greenville County Recreation District. The free event, held at Southside Park in Greenville, allowed preschoolers to elementary aged children the opportunity to see and touch large trucks and equipment such as dump trucks, fire trucks and tractors. Western Carolina's contribution of a Sewer Jet Truck gave area children the chance to explore a piece of machinery that may be different and new to them, while teaching them the truck's use in their lives. Employees of Western Carolina assisted children in learning about wastewater treatment and how the truck helps them in protecting the environment and our most precious natural resource, water.
