NACWA presented the prestigious Platinum Peak Performance Award to the Mauldin Road and Pelham Facilities. Platinum Awards recognize 100% compliance with National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits over a consecutive five year period. (See photo right)





Gold Peak Performance Awards were given to Gilder Creek, Lower Reedy, Slater-Marietta, Grove Creek, Piedmont, Durbin Creek and Georges Creek WWTPs, recognizing 100% compliance for 2008. NACWA's Silver Peak Performance Award was

presented to the Taylors WWTP for its outstanding compliance records in 2008. The Silver Peak Performance Awards recognize the achievement of member agencies for receiving no more than five NPDES permit violations. (See photo above)
