Renewable Water Resources Distributes Annual Report to the Community



Greenville, S.C. (January 20, 2010) – As part of its public education program, Renewable Water Resources (ReWa) recently released its “2009 Annual Report to the Community.” This folded insert, which provides information on the organization, its financial status and its capital improvements program, was distributed through local publications this month.

In addition to the standard financial information, the 2009 Report includes new information such as the release of the Upstate Roundtable Strategic Plan. The report also details specific demonstration projects that ReWa is evaluating, such as a biosolids reuse program and hydroelectricity. A description of ReWa’s continued partnerships with community organizations for public education has also been included.

ReWa utilizes the annual report as an informative, yet cost-effective communication to the public, as the 2009 report was printed and distributed through various local publications for a minimal cost of less than \$0.25 per piece.
