ReWa's Collections Department Maintains its Adopts-A-Highway

Greenville, S.C. (August 19, 2011) – Renewable Water Resources (ReWa) recently spent the day cleaning up litter on its adopted stretch of Mauldin Road as part of South Carolina's Adopt-A-Highway program. ReWa had 25 staff members volunteer to collect 38 bags of trash which ReWa properly disposed of.

ReWa's stretch of highway begins at their administrative office on Mauldin Road near the Reedy River and continues for two miles toward W Butler Road. The Adopt-A-Highway program, started in 1988, works to combat litter and keep South Carolina's highways beautiful and preserves the natural landscapes.
