South Carolina Water Associations Sponsor SRF Workshop

Greenville, S.C. (July 1st, 2009) – In partnership with the SC Section of American Water Works Association (AWWA), the Water Environment Association of SC (WEASC) and the SC Rural Water Association (SCRWA), Renewable Water Resources (ReWa) recently sponsored the State Revolving Loan Fund (SRF) Workshop on the American Recovery & Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). The workshop was held on June 24, 2009 at the Peebles Auditorium in Columbia, SC, featuring speakers from SCDHEC and EPA. Workshop participants were able to learn more about the potential benefits from the ARRA funds.

There are many new requirements connected with the Act which applicants must comply with in order to receive the funds. The focus of the workshop was to inform and guide those municipalities, consultants and contractors who have applied for ARRA funds. Speakers educated project members and answered questions on the key components of the Act and the SRF program.

Renewable Water Resources (ReWa)

ReWa's goal is to promote a cleaner environment, and to protect the public health and water quality of the Upstate waterways, while providing and developing the necessary sewer infrastructure for the growing economy. ReWa serves more than 400,000 industrial, commercial and residential customers in Greenville County and parts of Anderson, Spartanburg, Pickens and Laurens Counties.
