Renewable Water Resources Supports The Children's Museum of Greenville Dynamic Water Feature to Include Wastewater Treatment Replica

Greenville, S.C. (August 6, 2009) – Joining the many Upstate companies and organizations to support The Children's Museum of the Upstate (TCM), Renewable Water Resources (ReWa) recently sponsored and participated in the development of TCM's educational water feature, the Reedy River Bend.
