Renewable Water Resources Wins 2nd Place in State Competition Event

Greenville, SC (December 18, 2009) – Renewable Water Resources (ReWa) received second place in the Process Control Event in the 2009 Operations Challenge competition. The event is held at the Water Environment Association of South Carolina's (WEASC) Annual Environmental Conference.



The Operations Challenge is an annual competition, which takes place across the country at the state-level WEF conferences. The event encourages wastewater treatment workers to compete in five events to test their operations skills and abilities. The participating teams compete in process control, laboratory, pump repair, safety, and collection events.
