Renewable Water Resources Participates in Conestee Lake Clean-Up

Greenville, S.C. (March 18, 2009) – Renewable Water Resources (ReWa) recently participated in the 2nd Annual Lake Conestee Clean-Up on Saturday, March 7, 2009. The clean-up event is hosted by The Conestee Foundation to help preserve the 400-acre natural habitat on the Reedy River.



The event drew many groups, including about a dozen ReWa employees and family members participating. The group focused on the Log Shoals Road and Mauldin Road sides of the lake, combing the water for tires and other forms of waste. After several hours of clean up, they collected a total of six dumpsters of trash and approximately 50 tires. Participants took tires from the lake to the Mauldin Treatment Plant to be picked up by Michelin Tire for recycling.
