ReWa Clearing Up FOG

ReWa's FOG Campaign Educates Residents about Clean Water

Greenville, S.C. (February 10, 2009) – Renewable Water Resources (ReWa) is continuing its community-wide initiative to provide awareness about the hazards of pouring Fats, Oils and Grease (FOG) into our plumbing system. These unwanted materials pollute our natural environments and clog our pipes and drains.

To relieve the FOG problem, ReWa has partnered with the Parker Sewer & Fire Subdistrict (PSFS) to distribute more than 300 FOG cans in the local PSFS service area. This effort is part of ReWa's larger campaign to educate the public on how to properly dispose of FOG. ReWa and PSFS hope this partnership will keep our rivers, lakes and streams clean. Both organizations will continue to distribute more FOG cans in efforts to continue educating the public about safe disposal of FOG.
