**ReWa Presents Goldfish at Elementary School Health Fair**



Greenville, S.C. (November 25, 2008) – Renewable Water Resources (ReWa) – formerly known as Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority – recently presented at the Robert E. Cashion Elementary School Annual Health Fair.

At the event, ReWa’s Line Maintenance Crew Leader Terry Childress presented an informative study for the students and teachers, regarding the clean water ReWa processes. Childress took a sample of ReWa’s effluent - the water from businesses and homes that it cleans before returning it to the Upstate’s water environments – and used it to fill fish bowls. Students and teachers were able to observe a family of goldfish successfully living in the effluent water, to demonstrate the quality and cleanliness of ReWa’s effluent.

The evening event, sponsored by the school’s PTA, brings together organizations within Greenville, like public utilities, fire stations and the Deputy Sheriff. ReWa has presented at the Health Fair for several years. The effluent-housed goldfish are still thriving and have since become family pets.
