Mauldin Middle School Group Tours ReWa Facility

Greenville, S.C. (November 12, 2008) – ReWa (Renewable Water Resources) – formerly Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority - recently hosted a group of 27 sixth through eighth graders for a tour at its Gilder Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant. The group, from Mauldin Middle School, toured the plant to learn more about wastewater treatment process and protecting the environment. The group was able to gain first-hand knowledge from ReWa operator Kyle Lindsay.

ReWa hosts facility tours for local schools, colleges/universities, businesses, home schoolers, organizations, Girl and Boy Scout Troops, industries and environmental interest groups as part of its public education program. The program is an ongoing effort to increase awareness about the importance of the wastewater treatment process and protecting the aquatic environment of the Upstate.
