ReWa Hosts National Student Leadership Conference Participants

Greenville, S.C. (May 6, 2010) – Renewable Water Resources (ReWa) recently hosted more than 120 middle college students from various schools across the country for the 2010 Student Leadership Conference.

The four-day conference which is held by the Middle College National Consortium (MCNC) featured the theme *“Water Sustainability: How We Live with Our Rivers.”* The group participated in a tour of ReWa’s Gilder Treatment Plant to learn more about wastewater treatment process and how it impacts local rivers, lakes and streams. The plant features many new treatment upgrades including the use of UV light.

Middle College High Schools are secondary schools, located on or close to college campuses across the country, educating underserved students who have potential to benefit from a rigorous academic curriculum offered within a supportive and nurturing environment.
