TCM hosted a variety of activities and demonstrations to educate children about opportunities to help make positive differences in the local environment during the week of Earth Day.

ReWa debuted its new kids feature: Down the Drain Game.

The interactive board lets kids think about what common household items are safe to go down the drain, and which should be disposed of in another manner: trash, recycling or special disposal. Freshwater Freddie, ReWa's mascot for its public education campaign, was at the event to teach our youngest members of the community about the proper disposal of fats, oils and grease.
