Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority Turns Over New “Green” Leaf Announcing New Organizational Identity

Greenville, S.C. (October 30, 2008) – Western Carolina Regional Sewer Authority is now **ReWa (Renewable Water Resources)**. In keeping with the organization’s expanding green practices, including the development of an environmentally-sustainable Administrative Building, it was decided to turn over a new, green leaf with the organization as a whole.

ReWa’s service to the community is to protect our water resources; we treat and clean used water from homes and businesses, making it safe to place back into our environment. The drought this past year reminded the community how precious water is as a resource, so it is **ReWa’s** commitment, as an organization and as individual community members, to preserve our water environments.

By introducing clean water back into our rivers, lakes and streams, **ReWa** replenishes the water resources that our community use depletes. Focusing on sustainability helps ensure that our limited natural resources will be available for future generations.
