Renewable Water Resources Hosts Greenville County Teacher for Continuing Education

Greenville, S.C. (August 25, 2009) – Renewable Water Resources (ReWa) recently hosted a group of 15 teachers for a tour at its Pelham Road treatment plant. The group of teachers, from a variety of schools in the Greenville County School District, toured the plant as part of a program sponsored by the



Greenville Soil & Water Commission. Teachers toured various environmental facilities throughout the County earning continuing education credit.

ReWa Operations Foreman Perry Ashmore directed the facility tour to explain the process of wastewater treatment and the technology involved. ReWa regularly offers plant tours as part of its public education program. The facility tours are designed to increase awareness of the wastewater treatment process and how the community can participate in protecting our area's valuable aquatic resources.

Tours are provided for local groups and/or individuals and topics can be tailored to fit the need of the group.
